Patients give a \$20.00 donation for their office visit and those that cannot afford the donation are asked to donate 4 hours to a local charity.

The hours are Tuesdays 6:30-8:30pm and Saturdays 9:30-11:30am. The clinic is first come first served.

The clinic also offers a Multi Disciplinary Pain Clinic every 4th Monday by Dr. Snyder
